Franklin’s Academic Program Scholarships are non-refundable awards available to new degree-seeking students not currently enrolled in the specific academic program listed below. Scholarship awards of \$1,000 per trimester for six consecutive trimesters can be used for tuition and book expenses only and cannot be combined with any other Franklin University scholarships or discounts. Applications will be reviewed in the order received, up to the stated deadline listed below. These scholarships are automatically renewed for up to six consecutive terms of enrollment, pending that the recipient meets all conditions outlined in the Scholarship Agreement.

Scholarship Eligibility

- New student not currently enrolled at Franklin University who will be seeking a degree in one of the following programs:
 - Undergraduate: Criminal Justice, Public Safety Management & Leadership, Interactive Media Design, or Emergency Management & Homeland Security
 - Graduate: Computer Science or Criminal Justice Leadership Certificate
- Average cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher from prior institution(s) attended (transcripts required)
- Enrollment in a minimum of 6 credit hours for each term awarded (consecutive enrollment required)
- U.S. citizen or resident of the United States
- Must enroll and begin classes in the intended term indicated on the Franklin Admission Application
 - Recipients who do not start will have their award canceled and will need to reapply at the time of actual enrollment for reconsideration.
- Completion and submission of the Scholar Information and Scholarship Acceptance form is required before funds can be credited to the recipient’s account

1. Scholarship recipients must meet the scholarship criteria outlined on the Academic Scholarship Application for consideration.
2. Scholarship recipients must begin classes in the intended trimester as specified on the Franklin Admission Application. Recipients who do not enroll and begin classes in the intended trimester will have their award removed and will need to reapply for available scholarship offerings at the time of actual enrollment.
3. Scholarship awards will be automatically renewed for up to 6 consecutive trimesters, pending that the recipient maintains at least a 3.0 Franklin University cumulative GPA, remains in good academic standing and is making continuous progress toward an eligible academic program listed on the Academic Program Scholarship Application. Scholarship recipients must be enrolled in and complete a minimum of 6 credit hours at Franklin University each trimester of consecutive enrollment.
